


Senate

- Senate returned on May 4
 - Limit staff in offices
 - Keep 6 ft. distance when possible or wear a mask
 - Health Screening Inventory and self-monitoring temperatures.

House

- House Rules change on May 15
 - Designate a proxy for voting
 - Limited to 45 days but extendable
 - Official Committee business can be virtual

COVID-19 NIH Emergency Funding \$ 3.6 billion



- Bill 1.0 : Coronavirus Preparedness and Response Supplemental
 - Passed March 5
- Bill 2.0 : Families First Coronavirus Response Act
 - Passed March 18
- Bill 3.0 : Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act
 - Passed March 27
- Bill 3.5 : Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act
 - Passed April 24



Emergency Funding 4.0




FY 2021 Appropriations bills

Needs \$11 billion for FY2021 Without an exemption pulled from LHHS?


