#### **FY 2021 So Far**

- Currently under a Continuing Resolution
  - First through December 11, 2020
  - Second proposed through December 18, 2020
  - Funding level is FY 2020 enacted, prorated for the time period
- Type 1 Diabetes mandatory funding (\$150 million) partially reauthorized for the same two periods.

### **Appropriations Action: House**

- FY 2021 bill voted out of full Committee on July 15, with a \$500 million increase over FY 2020.
- Passed by House on July 31 in the second "minibus" of two, with five other bills including Defense.
- Floor amendments added \$29 million to the Committee level for NICHD, NIMHD, NIMH, NIAMS, and NIDA.
- In addition, the bill included \$5 billion of emergency supplemental appropriations to OD, of which more than half is transferred to the ICs and the B&F account.

### **Appropriations Action: Senate**

- On November 10, the Senate Appropriations Committee released bill language and an explanatory statement for each Subcommittee.
- Funding level for NIH is \$2 billion above FY 2020.
- Targeted increases, *e.g.*, Alzheimer's disease (\$354 million), premature birth (\$50 million), cancer research investigator grants (\$88 million).
- Includes \$229 million from the HHS Nonrecurring Expenses Fund to complete construction funding for the Clinical Center's new Surgery, Radiology, and Laboratory Medicine wing.
